

I Spy:

Player#1 picks an item that can be seen on the computer screen by both Zoom participants. The player then says, "I spy with my little eye something that is...." then the player gives a clue (is red, is square, is small, etc...)



Draw Together:

To use the whiteboard feature, simply click "Screenshare" and then select "Whiteboard."

Would You Rather:

Player #1 Asks a player #2 an "OR" question. Player #1 Answers, then explains why

Example:

Would you rather eat pizza every night for a month
OR

Wear stinky socks on your hand for 3 days

Category Concentration

Start by picking a topic (ie... Foods, Flowers, States, Animals, Shapes...etc...)

Then you begin by saying:

This is the game of concentration

No Mistakes

No Hesitation

Category is: (Insert topic)

You take turns saying an item in the topic, for example:

If the category is Desserts

Player #1 Says Cheesecake

Player #2 Says Cupcakes

Player #1 Says Cookies, etc...

If a player repeats something that has already been said, says something that doesn't belong in the category or hesitates longer than 2-3 seconds they are out!

Charades:

Players take turns acting out an object, movie, place, etc...
The other player tries to guess what is being acted out

See but No Hear:

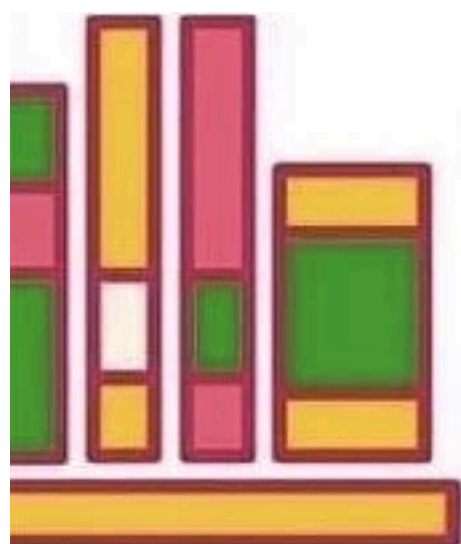
Player#1 mutes their microphone and Player #2 tries to guess what they are saying without sound

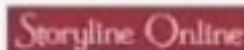
